

e-UPDATE #111 - 12.06.23

Good afternoon! Welcome to this latest update.

I hope you had a good weekend. There was thunder and lightning in the air as I left Cheltenham yesterday to travel to Westminster. More stormy weather in Parliament today...

Back in Cheltenham, there are some important updates below. I invited the **German Ambassador** to our town last week to meet local modern languages and politics students.

He was clearly very impressed by the Bournside, Pittville, St Edward's and Cheltenham

College students he met - as he was by Cheltenham in general. Always nice to see!

I also met Cheltenham's **Hong Kongers** in Pittville Park, joined the **Ukrainian** Community at a fundraiser in Bethesda Methodist Church, and attended a service to mark 200 years of worship in **Cheltenham's Synagogue.** 

There's positive news below about **Gloucestershire Constabulary** receiving **a further £774,000 of Government funding to tackle domestic abuse** following a successful bid from PCC Chris Nelson. The funding will be used to train frontline staff to spot early signs of domestic abuse and to encourage early interventions.

In my ministerial role, I announced that trolls who hide behind the anonymity of the internet to encourage others to cause themselves serious harm will face prosecution as part of an **overhaul of online safety laws.** 

I am also pleased to report that the number of **prison leavers in employment** six months after release has more than **doubled** from 14% to 30% since April 2021. That's good for society, and good for the rehabilitation of offenders.

And I have also announced a ground-breaking new prisoner transfer arrangement with Albania which will see hundreds of Albanian nationals in prisons in England and Wales sent back to Albania.

And there's a potholes update of course!

#### **ALEX SWORN IN AS LORD CHANCELLOR**

Alex was officially sworn in as Lord Chancellor at the Royal Courts of Justice.

The swearing-in took place before the Lord Chief Justice, Lord Burnett of Maldon; Master of the Rolls, Sir Geoffrey Vos; Senior President of Tribunals, Sir Keith Lindblom and Chancellor of the High Court, Sir Julian Flaux.

Please find below an extract from Alex's swearing-in speech:

"And so, as I sit here as your Lord Chancellor with responsibility for our justice system, I am aware of the responsibility I hold. It's like carrying a Ming vase – ancient, priceless... but also fragile – and doing so whilst walking across a polished floor.

"What access to justice and independence of the judiciary mean in practice is this: as you walk out of this court having lost, you know deep down that despite your disappointment you have been heard by judges of enormous intellect and unimpeachable integrity. And you have had a full and fair hearing.

It is difficult to overstate how precious that is."

## ALEX ANNOUNCES GROUND-BREAKING NEW ALBANIAN PRISONER TRANSFER ARRANGEMENT

Alex has announced that the UK and Albanian governments have agreed a ground-breaking arrangement that will see **hundreds of Albanian prisoners returned to their home country.** 

Under the new arrangement, Albanian nationals in prisons in England and Wales serving sentences of 4 years or more will be sent back to Albania to see out the remainder of their terms in Albanian prisons.

#### Alex said:

"The public expects that foreign criminals should serve their sentences overseas – not in our prisons at the expense of the taxpayer.

"This deal will speed up the removal of these offenders and give victims confidence that serious criminals will continue to face justice and spend the remainder of their sentence

behind bars. Collaboration with our international partners is an essential part of making this possible."

THOUSANDS MORE EX-PRISONERS IN WORK

The number of **prison leavers in employment** within six months has more than **doubled** from 14% to 30% since April 2021 following a major Government drive to reduce reoffending and plug labour shortages.

Alex officially opened a new workshop run by international logistics firm DHL at HMP High

**Down** to help boost education and training.

It will function as a DHL warehouse for sorting and picking goods to be shipped to other prisons across the country giving prisoners experience of managing the movement of stock within the warehouse and the processing of goods.

#### Alex said:

"Our drive to improve prison education and business links is helping cut crime, with more prisoners going straight into work on release than ever before.

"Helping reformed offenders kickstart a new, law-abiding career is a win-win - it makes our streets safer while providing businesses with the reliable staff they need to help drive the British economy."

ALEX ANNOUNCES THAT TROLLS WHO ENCOURAGE SERIOUS SELF-HARM WILL FACE JAIL

Vile trolls who hide behind the anonymity on the internet to encourage others to cause themselves serious harm will face prosecution as part of **Alex's overhaul of online safety laws.** 

The new overhaul will make it a crime to encourage someone to cause serious self-harm, regardless of whether or not victims go on to injure themselves. Those convicted face up to 5 years in prison.

#### Alex said:

"There is no place in our society for those who set out to deliberately encourage the serious self-harm of others. Our new law will send a clear message to these cowardly trolls that their behaviour is not acceptable.

"Building on the existing measures in the Online Safety Bill our changes will make it easier to convict these vile individuals and make the internet a better and safer place for everyone



#### **GROT SPOT UPDATE**

As part of his 'grot spot' campaign, Alex has pressed **CBC and GCC** to address local eyesores including potholes, blocked drains and graffiti.

Since the last update, the Highways Department have agreed to Alex's request for the following roads to be resurfaced:

- Parts of Old Bath Road
- Parts of Shurdington Road
- Parts of Caernarvon Road

In addition, potholes will be filled in The Park and Gloucester Road. Alex is also pressing for the **London Road near the junction with East End Road** to be fixed; the road surface is in a particularly poor condition.

# BOURNSIDE AND ROWANFIELD JUNIOR SCHOOL RECEIVE 'CONDITION IMPROVEMENT FUND' BOOST

**Bournside School** and **Rowanfield Junior School** have both been awarded a grant from the Government's 'Condition Improvement Fund'.

The grants will enable Rowanfield Junior School to carry out **fire safety work** whilst Bournside will upgrade its **boiler** and **heating infrastructure** with a low carbon solution.

The funding is in addition to the extra £2.3 million already awarded directly to Cheltenham schools earlier this month.



#### ALEX EXTENDS ACCESS TO LEGAL SUPPORT TO MILLIONS OF VULNERABLE PEOPLE

Alex has announced that **domestic abuse victims and children** are among millions more people who will now have access to legal aid.

The move will see over 6 million more vulnerable people able to access funded legal support as the Government pledges £25 million to boost the legal aid system every year.

It means domestic abuse victims on universal credit and seeking a protective order can access legal aid funding more easily without facing a means test.

#### Alex said:

"Widening access to legal aid secures justice and strengthens the rule of law.

"These changes mean more vulnerable people like domestic abuse victims will be able to access the protection of the courts."

#### MAJOR BOOST TO TREE PLANTING IN GLOUCESTERSHIRE

Alex has welcomed news that Gloucestershire County Council has planted a further 130,006 trees this planting season.

This is another step closer to GCC's ambition to plant one million trees by 2030.

Alex is also backing GCC's plans to create a **green corridor for wildlife** by planting more than **3,000 trees** on a disused railway site between Bournside School and Canterbury Walk

# ALEX INTRODUCES BETTER SUPPORT FOR BEREAVED FAMILIES AND EYEWITNESSES OF HOMICIDE AND MAJOR INVESTMENT

Alex has announced that bereaved families and eyewitnesses of homicide or major criminal incidents like the Manchester Arena bombing will receive a new package of support.

The Homicide Service - which provides emotional and practical support to families bereaved by murder or manslaughter - will be extended to those who witness a homicide or major criminal incident across England and Wales.

#### Alex said:

"The Homicide Service provides vital support to the families of victims under the worst of circumstances – ensuring they have the emotional and practical help they need to cope with their loss.

"By expanding the service to include eyewitnesses and bereaved families of major incidents across England and Wales thousands more people will be able to access the support they need as early as possible."



**ALEX VISITS SNARESBROOK CROWN COURT** 

Alex visited Snaresbrook Crown Court for his first official court visit as Lord Chancellor.

Alex viewed the latest technology used in court, and met with staff and thanked them for their hard work reducing the outstanding caseload.

# Rape victims' personal records to be protected from unnecessary 'fishing expeditions'



# ALEX ANNOUNCES END TO INTRUSIVE FISHING EXPEDITIONS OF RAPE VICTIMS' THERAPY NOTES

Victims of rape will no longer face unnecessary and invasive requests to access their therapy notes or other personal records during the investigation stage.

For the first time, the law will clearly set out that **police should only request material that is absolutely necessary and proportionate** to ensure that vulnerable victims aren't put off seeking vital support.

This will end 'fishing expeditions' for information that can be irrelevant to the investigation and will help ensure vulnerable victims aren't put off reporting rape for fear that their notes could be used against them in court.

#### Alex said:

"This important reform will end invasive unnecessary requests for therapy notes for rape victims and give them the confidence to seek the help they need earlier, free from the fear that what they share in the process of healing could be weaponised against them."
